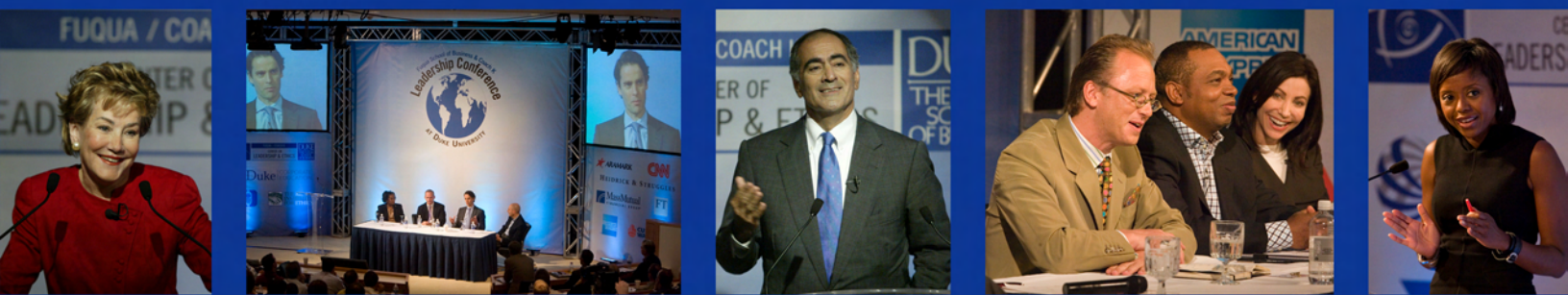

COLE's activities bridge theory and practice and provide numerous opportunities for involvement and learning to students, academics, and practitioners.

To advance leadership and ethics research, COLE prioritizes, facilitates and disseminates research results to foster a greater understanding and appreciation of the field in both the academic and practitioner realms. An example is the Duke University Executive Leadership Survey, an annual survey tracking senior executive perspectives on organizational leadership issues and their implications in today's environment and over time.

Under the direction of Faculty Director Sim B. Sitkin and Managing Director Sanyin Siang, the Center has assembled a distinguished Leadership Advisory Board, Center Scholars Committee, Visiting Scholars, Executives-in-Residence, Research Director, and Management Team to help advance its mission. The world is shifting rapidly. Boundaries are blurred. All sessions are moderated by Duke faculty and scholars, and are designed to allow participants to easily learn and interact with the speakers and from one another.
